Notes on hydroelectric-power scheme permissions

Abstraction and impoundment licences

We regularly make routine visits to make sure that your licences are up to date and that any work to abstract (remove) or impound (hold back or restrict) water keeps to the conditions of the relevant licence.

You will not have to pay any yearly charge for your new abstraction or impoundment licence.

If you are not satisfied with the conditions of your licence, you can appeal to the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (if your hydroelectric-power scheme is in England) or the Welsh Ministers (if the scheme is in Wales.) You can get a standard form for making an appeal from the relevant address below.

You must return the appeal form **within 28 days** of the date you received the form. (In exceptional circumstances, the Secretary of State and Welsh Ministers, whichever is appropriate, can give you longer to make your appeal). In the form you must give the reasons for the appeal, and you must also send:

- a copy of the applications for the licences;
- copies of any information or report you sent us with the application forms;
- this letter; and
- any other relevant correspondence.

At the same time you must send us a copy of the notice and documents to:
